Dear Members,

Although 1986 has been a very quiet year for us, it has certainly been the best year so far. At the end of December we had over 100 members, the most we have ever had, but as we know each year people do not rejoin, so this figure is sure to drop at the beginning of the year. For some members this will be their last newsletter they receive, as like each year some of you have decided not to rejoin for one reason or another. It would be nice if these members could let us know their reasons for not rejoining, so in the future we can hopefully put things right.

In 1986 a staggering 13 State Registered Purebreds have been imported from Spain. A new stock list will be sent to members with their 1987 membership. The classes at the Spillers Ardingly Show were such a success and many thanks to members who travelled such long distances to bring their horses to support the breeds first outing in public. The turnout was so good that we have been invited back this year and it is the members who supported the classes in 86 that we have to thank for putting the Spanish Horse into the Public eye. A lot of people write articals and books, but it is getting the horses out and about that is going to really put the Spanish Horse back where he belongs as the most important breed in the World. This year we have 4 shows including our own Breed Show so we are gaining a lot of respect as a serious breed Society. We are very respected for our Breeding policy that is run alongside the Spanish Cria Caballar in Spain and we are very grateful for their guidance. Some people seem to think we are dictated to, but it is not that way at all and most members will agree that it is not only the Spanish Horse they love, but Spain and all that is part of Spain as well.

This September we are again getting the Cria Caballar over from Spain to grade all our Purebred Youngstock for inclusion in the Spanish State Stud Book. It is very important that all breeding stock is graded and approved for breeding so that the Spanish Horse never gets spoilt by indiscriminant breeding like so many other breeds do. The members who's stock is ready for grading will be notified by the Committee as soon as all dates are confirmed. It was lovely to see Andalusians at Olympia at Christmas. Our Chairman John Parker was there with his marvellous team of Hungarian horses and of course Piconero. What a super horse he is. This year he was not in the carriage, but was instead the mount of Buffalo Bill. Susan Townsend was Buffalo Bill and it was lovely to see them come bouncing into the arena together. Also Yasmin Smart was there and brought some real glamour to Olympia with her lovely Arab Liberty horses. Yasmin also had her beautiful Bay Purebred Andalusian with her. Despierto was ridden by Yasmin's husband in the parade and although it was his first time in the spotlight he behaved perfectly. It was lovely to see Yasmin's Lusitano Bailaor again. The last time I saw him in early 1980's Joaquin Rodriguez used him for a display at Moira Vickers establishment, he is a lot whiter now but still as beautiful. We hope members will send in more articals about their horses for future Newsletters and we also hope to be including more articals about training the Spanish Horse and Classical riding. ## LETTERS

Dear Society Member,

Several years ago on one of my visits to England I had the pleasure of meeting ex-secretary Miss Mary McBryde, she showed particular interest in Spanish Horses and also in my proposed project of the establishment of a high class training and riding school here in Andalusia. Subsequently in August of this year I paid a private visit to England with a friend of mine named, Senor Juan Llamas, who as you are undoubtedly aware, is the person who controls the breeding of Spanish Andalusians in the Spanish Stud Book. The purpose of our visit was to view some of the Spanish Andalusians that are already in England. We realised that what we saw and from people with whom we talked, that there is a great deal of enthusiasm and interest in England for the Spanish breeds.

I would like to take this opportunity to inform you that I have in fact established my own Training and Riding School here on the Costa del Sol. We have 15 first class Spanish Andalusian stallions, all registered in the Spanish Stud Book. Many of them are already trained in "Spanish Step", "Passage", "Piaffe", "Colloppian", and change of flight to different steps and Pirueta. We also undertake the training of horses in Dressage, Classic and Doma Espanola de Campo, together with private lessons to experienced riders in the afore mentioned styles. All this is supervised by myself. The health and well being of the horses is supervised by Sr. Sanz Parejo who is a profesor at Cordoba Veterinary University.

We have had a tremendous interest since establishing the school, both national and International and we have already established close links with other European Countries. We are at present drawing up plans to construct a far larger establishment in typical Spanish Cortijo Style, we feel it is necessary to construct new premises in order to accomodate the current huge demand, and the as yet untapped demand that we feel exists for this type of establishment. We hope to incorporate our own breeding establishment within this complex and upon completion it will be the premier equestrian centre on this coast.

The school is not undertaken on a purely commercial basis, I have established the school primarily because of my own great personal love and interest in the Spanish Horse. I would enjoy the opportunity to establish liasions with similar minded persons in England. Towards this end I would like to inform you, that we are quite prepared to avail your members of the facilities I have spoken of in this letter. I would also be very nappy to give help, advise and consultations on any matters regarding the Spanish Horse. We also have available from time to time, fully trained, high quality Spanish Stallions, for sale to selected customers, we emphasise that we must be very selective with the sale of these horses. We have already exported Spanish Horses to several other European countries and so are fully conversant with export procedures etc.

Jenny asked me some time ago if I would write a piece for the Newsletter and as the next breeding season will shortly be upon us I decided to take a small extract from my last book HORSEKEEPING SMALL SCALE BREEDING and update members with my plans regarding Jubiloso and future stud work.

" A normal healthy stallion, fit from exercise and fed enough but no more than keeps him in condition, will perform his stud duties without difficulty. But it is not just the covering but the preliminary trying and teasing that takes the time and trouble. No mare should be forced to accept a stallion unless she is fully in season and ready to breed. Methods that are undoubtedly used at some studs in order to get the mare served so as to charge the fee are not to be condoned and in any case in the vast majority of cases only prove to be a waste of time. I am sure that members have little to fear on this score from the Society's stallion owners but there are places with a stallion that is popular that do not have the time to wait if all the mares that are accepted are to be covered.

When the time comes a mare will accept the stallion readily enough, but with some mares this period can be very short - perhaps only a day in extreme cases. This is why in my opinion mares should be tried every day as they approach their period of heat so that one can judge exactly the right time for the service and thus ensure a high rate of success.

A mare has two ovaries, which alternately produce an egg (ovum) that is released when ripe for fertilization and this must take place at exactly the right part of the mare's uterine tract for a healthy foetus to result. The period of oestrus is commonly known as being in season or in heat. A mare will normally come into oestrus every twenty-one days from the beginning of one heat period to the beginning of the next. The normal duration of the heat period will be approximately seven days, and the ripened egg will be in the correct position for fertilization about three days before the end of oestrus. When ejaculated into the mare a stallion's spermatozoa will normally live up to three days inside her genital tract, where the strongest of the millions of sperms will swim up to the top of the oviduct and wait to fertilize an egg. There are, however, considerable variations in this procedure. A mare may have a weak and long drawn-out oestrus, perhaps early on in the season, or may have an intense one in the height of summer that lasts no more than a day or so. A stallion, too, can vary in the length of time the sperms he produces will live after ejaculation. Some very potent stallions will produce sperms that live inside the mare for as long as seven days, while others may have sperms that only live a particularly short life of a day or two. All this shows why I consider it necessary for the stud to have the time to treat each mare with careful attention so that teasing and trying can be carried out thoroughly.

With a drawn-out oestrus the best time for service will probably be from the fourth day, whereas the second day will be best if the oestrus is short and intense. As soon as I am sure the mare is fully in heat I usually have the stallion serve her every day or every other day until I am satisfied that she is going out of season. This is where both the mare and stallion will help the observant handler. A stallion will communicate his knowledge of the mare's readiness when teasing her by the intensity of his reactions, as will the mare when truly ready. I deal with this in detail in a later chapter but here I mention it to point out why I dislike the use of hobbles or similar restraints to force a service on a mare, as this often results in it being given too soon. Not only is it useless to serve the mare at the wrong time but it is also dangerous if force of any kind is used in order to achieve this. I have never used these methods and object to their use.

There is always a reason for a mare to refuse to come into season or not willingly to accept the stallion, and it is important to understand them. It may be due to no more than nervousness on the part of a maiden mare, especially if she is only two or three years old, and patient teasing and trying to get the timing exactly right will overcome this problem. On the other hand, some mares' refusal can be due to their instinctively knowing that something is wrong, that she should not be bred from because she has defective equipment for doing so. A Veterinary examination will often reveal the cause, and in many cases can be successfully treated. Sometimes a hormone injection can be given to release the egg into the follicle to travel down to be fertilized. Some owners will want to put a mare that has foaled straight back to the stallion at her first heat (the foaling heat) after giving birth. This is not a good time as the fertility of the mare is low, but it may be - perhaps with an old mare - that the owner thinks she will not come into season again. If the mare does not come into season the vet can induce ovulation, but here again I am not entirely convinced that this is always a good thing, and careful consideration should be given to whether a foal from the mare is important enough to make it worthwhile."

In presenting this short extract to mare owners I hope it will explain why, as a stallion owner, I only accept a limited number of mares and that next season I shall have to increase the charges. For 1987 the stallion fee will be £160 paid when the mare is collected, with £40 refunded if the mare is certified not in foal by Oct 1st. Additional to this the mares keep will be £3 per day payable 4 weeks in advance with the balance paid when she is collected. This represents a considerable increase to the rates previously charged but when it is considered against the time given to each mare as well as the maintenance costs it represents a very modest sum compared to the charges made by any other professional service. ## RADIANTE

### A Horse in a Million

Radiante was born in 1963 at the stud of D. Miguel Angel de Cardenas Lllavanera, in Eciija, Sevilla in the heart of Andalusia.

Radiante's sire was the famous Bilbaino III of the famous Terry Stud. Bilbaino III has sired so many of the top horses in Spain including, Carinoso III, Descarado III & IV, Estudiante II, Famoso III, Corron II, Hacendoso IV also a famous sire in his own right. Nevado who is featured in the book Equus by Robert Vavra, Tabu who was also famous on television as the Moon Stallion, but he sadly died of colic a few years ago. Other famous stallions sired by Bilbaino III are Valido and Vasallo II both Champions of Spain like Radiante was. Also the famous mare Hosca who features on the Pedigrees of Ultimado II, Canador V and Jubiloso VI here in England, is also sired by Bilbaino III.



Radiante is owned by Mrs Di Belton, who purchased him from some people who found him at a horse sale, luckily his papers were still with him which is unusual as usually when horses go through dealers their papers seem to disappear.

The people who bought Radiante were hoping to show jump him, but they could not understand how, when they came to jump a fence, Radiante just leapt in the air, but up not over. When Di and her husband heard this it aroused their curiosity as Di's husband had been a pupil at the Spanish Riding School in Vienna and thought it sounded like the horse was doing airs above the ground. He was completely right as Radiante, when given the aid to take off was indeed, doing a superb Levade. As the horse would not show jump Di bought him and he was with her for about 12yrs. In that time he did a lot of advertising work and Di used him in her Dressage yard for teaching.

In 1984 our mare Coqueta went to be covered by Radiante, but sadly did not get in foal. The next year we were planning on taking her back to him, but Di said she was looking for a retirement home for the horse and that a man she knew had offered to have him, but not until the winter. She then very kindly offered us him for the Spring and Summer to cover the mares on their home ground. As soon as he arrived he took a special place in our lives. He is a huge 16.1hh and I am only 5'1", but he is so gentle to handle we couldn't believe it. He has taught us so much as we were complete novices where covering was concerned and the first time we didn't know how he would behave with the mares. We needn't of worried as like Di had told us he is a complete gentleman with his mares. As soon as he sees the mares he does the most beautiful passage and really shows off. It is really lovely to see and although he is very gentle to handle he still has a lot of fire and spirit in him. He is completely 100% in every way, and Di used to lend him to her local Pony Club for the children to practice bandaging horses. This temperament is so typical of the true Andalusians.

At the end of the summer we felt really down as we had grown to love the old horse so much as he had become one of the family. We had a phone call from his owner and thought she was ringing to say he had to go to his new home, but it was to say the man who was having him was now moving to Birmingham and could not have him after all so she didn't know what to do with him. We offered to have him for as long as she liked and he has been here ever since.

This summer he has not been too well and lost a lot of weight. The night before the Annual Dinner he was very ill and we had to call the vet out in the middle of the night to him. My son and I spent the night in the stable with him as we feared he would not last the night.

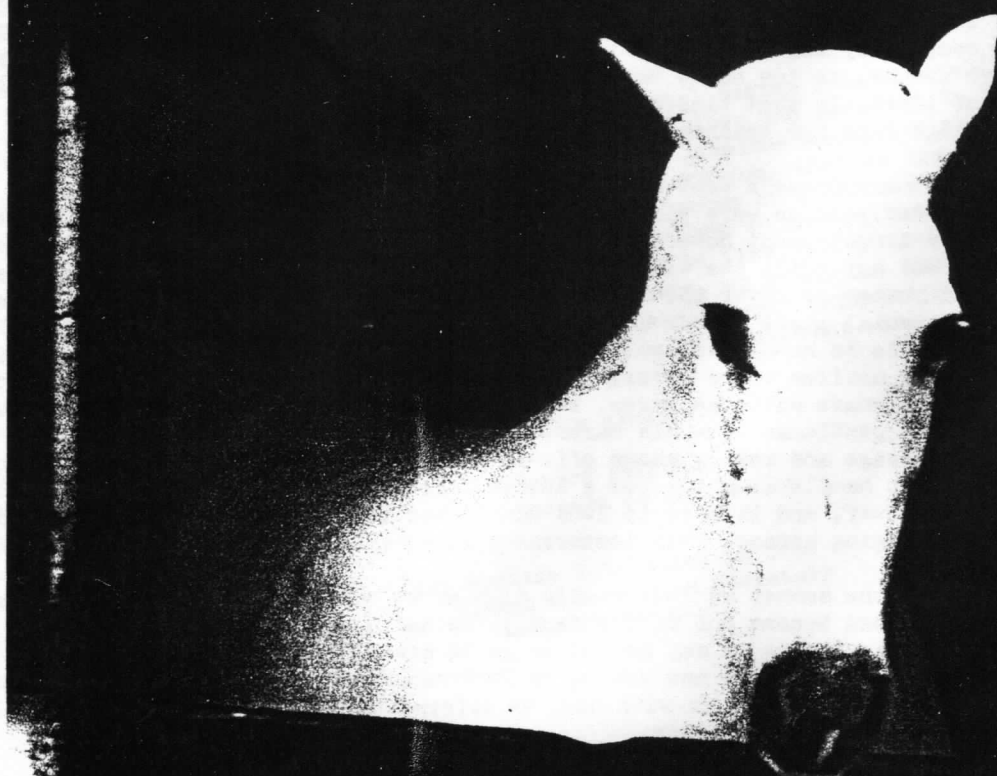

Thankfully in the morning he seemed better, but 2 days later he fell ill again. Our vet has taken all sorts of different tests and has found he has some problem with his blood supply. We are hoping to move to Wales in the near future and just pray Radiante will be well by then so he can come with us.

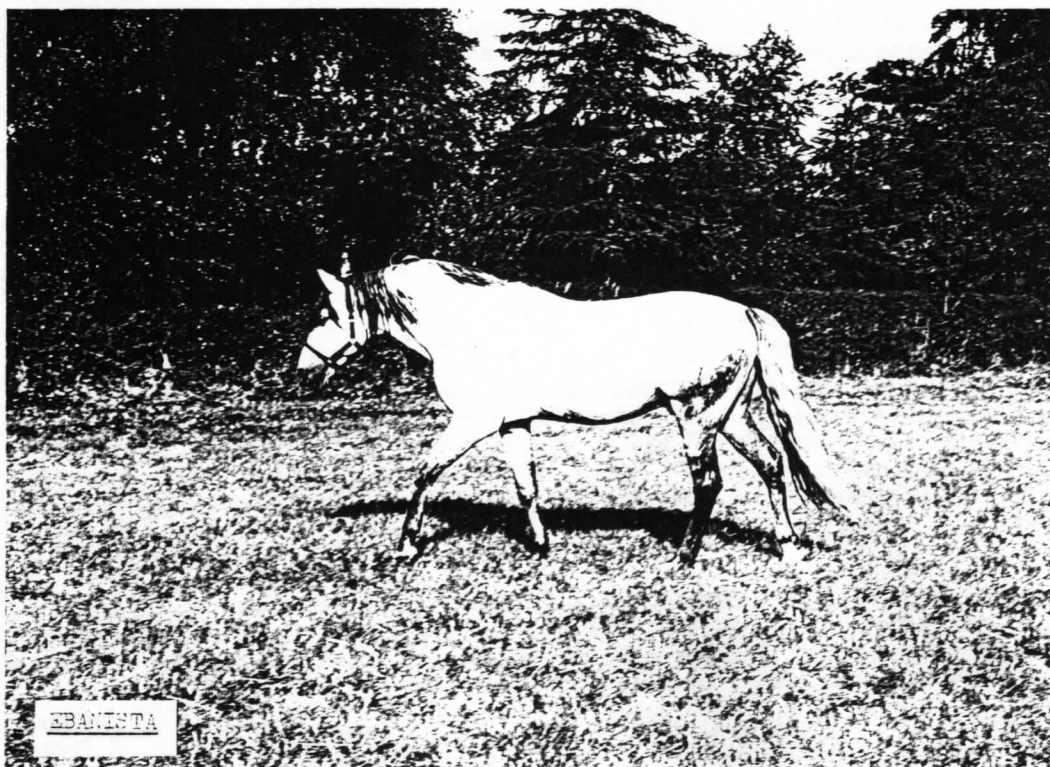
