Once again, Iberian horses will head into London on New Year's Day to take part in the 'All The Queen's Horses' parade. Patricke Kempe, who organises the Iberian team, announced that some familiar faces will be heading to the capital. Patrick will be joined by Ed & Chris Hannaford, Hannah Doggett, Jenny Myerscough, Susie Jennings, Sherene & Leila Rahmatallah as well as Amanda Cutler-Little & Caroline Clinkard on a mix of PRE and Lusitano horses. The parade began in 2012 and sees over 75 horses, of all breeds, parading through the streets of London to celebrate the New Year.

ANCCE Launches Renewed 'El Caballo Español' Magazine

ANCCE has renewed its breeder-orientated magazine with the help of Grupo Zeta following 37 years of production. ANCCE has revised the magazine in order to focus on new topics of interest in the PRE world, as well as a new modern design. ANCCE said of the renewal: "The virtues and blessings of the purebred Spanish horse are discussed throughout the magazine. There will be articles, reports and interviews covered and analyzed by journalists and newly incorporated collaborators—seasoned national and international technicians who will contribute their infinite knowledge. ANCCE are currently working on the 228th issue of the magazine, which is timed to coincide with the 25th anniversary celebration of SICAB.

14 PRE Horses Deemed 'Excellent' at the 12th Final for the Young Horse Selection Test for Dressage

The city of Jerez de la Frontera hosted the Young Horse Selection Test Final for the discipline of dressage over 23rd - 27th September 2015. The event was co-ordinated by ANCCE, together with the Spanish National Young Horse Championship Final, and acted as a qualifier for the ANCCE Cup Final.

Of the 145 qualified horses considered 'Excellent' for the dressage category for 4-year-olds, three PRE horses were included. Quincallo de Indalo from Yequada El Indalo—with an average of 75.400%--qualified first. Of the horses participating in the 5-year-old category, five were considered 'Excellent'. The PRE with the highest score was Albeitar TR from Yeguada Acosta Ponce with an average of 73.900%, thus taking second place. In the category for 6-year-olds, six horses were considered 'Excellent' for dressage; Juncal LXXXVII owned by Alfonso Gormaz Navarro was first with a maximum score for its age of 76.500%.

Eight horses were considered 'Very Good' for dressage in the 4-year-old category. There were five in the category for 5-year-olds, and three in the category for 6-year-olds.

Eight horses in the category for 4-yearolds were considered 'Good' as well as one horse in the 5-year-old category. The final concludes the 2015 dressage performance tests. A conformation performance test was also carried out during the competition, using the Lineal Conformation Score, which genetically assesses both the aptitude for dressage and for conformation. The horses who achieved the category of 'Recommended Young Breeding Stock' will be published in the corresponding breeder catalogue and in the PRE stud book.

ANCCE said of the performance selection event: "The high quality of the horses presented at both the PSCI Final and the Spanish National Young Horse Championships must be highlighted. Once again, there were a number of impressive PREs, including Manchego ARB owned by Cristina Durán. This PRE was the best qualified of the championship, with Kafú III, owned by Yeguada Centurión, placed fourth in the general ranking".

PRE Film Stars in New York

PREs became the stars of film once again in a new doumentary film. The film 'Rules & Passion', by Work Style, was created to promote the purebred Spanish horse and has been selected as a finalist at the Equus Film Festival. This unique event—held in New York on the 20th and 21st of November—is dedicated exclusively to horses.

The PRE stars in the film 'Rules & Passion' which shows the various aspects of breeding, selection, history, aptitudes and handling through first-hand contributions from the various participants. Filmed at privileged sites, with original music throughout, the project was shot on location at the various stud farms and institutions in Spain. ANCCE collaborated in the production and the governing body of the Spanish horse supplied data and offered backdrops so that the production department could transmit a more realistic image of the breed.

ANCCE President Celebrates 25th Anniversary of SICAB

ANCCE president Juan Tirado shared his enthusiasm of the silver anniversary of SICAB.

The president said "as a breeder and president of ANCCE, I am really proud that an event such as SICAB has reached this milestone as an uninterrupted event with 25 years of history. Few trade fairs in Andalusia, or even in Spain, can boast such an achievement." At the same time, he expressed his appreciation for the support given by institutions, sponsors, the media and breeders over the years. SICAB, which is encompassing the first PRE World Championships, is to be held at the Palacio de Congresos y Exposiciones (Fair Grounds) in Seville from 17th - 22nd of November. This year, the show has been titled "This is our Horse." It will star a variety of international equestrian performers who will provide the best example of equestrian art available in Spain today.

SHOW RESULTS

South West Iberian Show

The South West Iberian Show was held at The Grange in Okehampton from 5th - 6th September 2015.

The in hand partbred class saw a number of Spanish partbreds, with Abi-Laura May and Stanhopes Picasso clinching first place followed by Dante Espiritu and Taylor Fewster in second leaving Diosa RPB and Peter Luck in third.

The in hand purebred youngstock class went to St Pirans' Bierzo RPB, who won at the Royal Cornwall show earlier in the summer. Al Setari, owned by Susan Hocking of Al Kingston stud, came in third place in the in hand purebred females class behind two Lusitano mares. Jasi Su of the St Piran's stud came fourth and Morena LVII owned by Renu Brindle came fifth in the same section.

Notorious winner Peñueco gained the winning rosette in the in hand purebred males class, followed by his St Pirans' stablemate Ermitaño XX in second. Urgente XXIV, owned by Phillip Harris, came third with Mas Ural and Sarah Sutton in fourth and Golden de SYV with Janine Falle in fifth. The class was rounded up by Hidalgo LXII and Michelle Pearce in sixth.

AbI-Laura May and her striking coloured partbred Stanhopes Picasso returned once again for a win in the ridden partbreds class. Dante Espiritu was fourth and Alfonso Amadee came fifth in the same class.

The grey mare Jasi Su returned to secure second place in the ridden purebred females section, with Morena LVII finishing in third. Peñueco was crowned the winner in the male ridden purebred class, with Marfull and Julie Nicholas in fourth place, Hidalgo LXII in fifth, Mas Ural in sixth and Urgente XXIV rounding up the class in seventh place.

The parade class impressed spectators with Lynne Macleod and her stunning grey PRE winning the Best PRE award, and Ben Swann with Marea VII clinching Best Spanish Outfit. Champion PRE was awarded to Peñueco who returned to win the title of Supreme Champion of the entire show.

BAPSH BD Championships

The BAPSH BD championships were held at Keysoe on 7th November 2015. The highly anticipated finals were the first of its kind, with the PRE section

attracting a huge amount of entries. Competitors battled through strong wind and rain in order to fly the flag for the Spanish horse in the competition, which was sponsored by Eastelms International Horse Transport.

The preliminary 17 test was won by Lauren Spradbury riding her mother's Pomelo V. The duo scored 70.58% in the test, and they have gone from strength to strength since the palomino stallion was imported from the famous dilute breeder, Las Cadenas, last year.

Annette Andresen and Indio XXXV came second with an impressive 67.69% with Anita Sheldon and Holgado II in third with 66.73%.

Charlotte Crocker-Westlake rode her homebred black stallion, Lago Fulgor, to win the title of novice champion with a score of 66.61%. The pair had not long returned from Belgium following their victory in the MCI competition. Kim Gubler competed her own Saetillano NVW with a score of 65.36% and Lauren Spradbury returned with Pomelo V for third place and a total of 64.11%. Steve Wallace rode the impressive Isleño XCV for a victory in elementary 57 against 15 other competitors with a score totalling 73.57%. Isleño XCV, bred by Yequada Ovelar, has twice been supreme champion of the BAPSH breed show, displaying that the stallion's excellent functionality continues to prove itself.

Phyllis Young rode her veteran PRE, Letrado XI, for second place on 70.00% with Charlotte Crocker-Westlake and Lago Fulgor in third with 68.57%. The medium 75 class was hotly contended with a tie for first place. Rebecca Brennand and her PRE stallion Albero LXXX and Lynne Macleod and Novato Salvatella both came out with impressive scores of 64.86%. Suzanne Holt and Vinas II came third in the class with a total of 63.92%.

Masters du Cheval Iberique European Finals

The French-based Iberian dressage league held its European finals in Belgium over 30 October - 1 November 2015. A number of riders from Great Britain travelled to the continent to take part in the contest following qualifiers which had been held throughout the year. Nika Vorster rode Karen Bourdon's Chulo

Msuay in a very competitive Young Horse section to finish in 13th place.

Charlotte Crocker-Westlake and Lago Fulgor celebrated their second place in the Championship Level 1 section, followed by fellow Brit Patricia Townsend on Marques XC in third.

Debbie Symes rode Onassis RMC in stiff competition to finish 12th in the Championship Level 2 section.

Alice Hurley and Karen Bourdon's black stallion, Deseado CCV, finished in fourth place in the Championship Level 4 test closely followed by Rebecca Brennand and Barquero JF in fifth. Altogether the British team finished in fourth place. The hosts, Belgium, came out in the top position followed by France in second place and Italy in third. Following Britain, the Czechs came in fifth place with Spain rounding up the placings in sixth.

North West Open Show Championships

Amber Flynn and her bay PRE gelding won the Foreign Breeds championship title at the North West Open Show Championships, held at Croft Top Equestrian Centre in Accrington on 17th October 2015.

The pair have defended their title having won the same at the 2014 equivalent. The 18-year-old rider found Flynn when she moved to a new yard. She backed and produced him herself.



MY KINGDOM FOR A HORSE



Virginia Romero is a 29-year-old equine artist from Malaga. With customers that include some of the best known breeders in Spain, Virginia has an unquestionable talent for transforming our 'horse of kings' into canvas-sized keepsakes. Having exhibited her work at events such as SICAB and the USPRE's Equine Affaire, here we speak to the Malaga University graduate about her passions, inspirations and - of course - the PRE.

How old were you when you first started painting?

I remember when I was about 12-years-old, I asked my mother to take me to a painting class. We looked for suitable classes and finally we found a teacher near our home, who introduced me to the world of art. Of course, it just so happened that my first painting was a painting with a horse on it! My mother has it hung up on the wall of her living room. I remember him (the painting) fondly as my first ever piece of art. However, I have tried to convince my mother to switch the painting for another new one of mine, but it is an impossible mission.

Have you always used horses in your artwork?

Yes, I love human anatomy too and study the light and colours, but I always like to draw and paint horses. Ever since the first time I could hold a pencil I tried to 'do a horse'.



Why do you think horses make such good subjects?

Maybe it is the sensation that they produce in us, the passion that they create in us when we are living or remembering our time with horses. I always feel the need to translate that emotion, through my work, and share it with everybody who experiences that sensation too.

Do you own a horse?

I do. His name is Hermes, he lives free in a natural park in Cádiz. He has a little bipolar mind and is electric to ride but he is the sweetest horse with children and foals. His father was a PRE stallion who was part of the Royal Guard of the king of Spain, and he has cousins who were champion of some morphological contests here in Spain. Maybe that's where his 'sensitive' mind has come from.

One of the main focuses of your art seems to be the Spanish horse. Is there anything in particular which draws you to them?

People that don't have any familiarity with PRE horses think that they have a 'sad eye', but they do not see the mystic mixture of strength and nobility. I have always felt drawn to Spanish horses and, being from Spain, I perhaps see more of them than others. They are a poetic metaphor and their strength, grace and noblity make them fantastic subjects to say the least.

What inspires you on a daily basis?

I'm inspired every day by all of these sensations that we have talked about. I often draw without photo references so that I can remind myself that I should work from the essence of horses and I take my inspiration from the lines and light that create their presence.

What is your biggest challenge as an artist?

As with all professions, the biggest challenge is to continue with it for a good length of time. It is very important to have a passion as a job so that we can live 'our' dream. It is especially important to maintain that passion as an artist, otherwise you may as well not do it.

What do you do with your time when you aren't painting?


I love to spend time with my partner and my family. I enjoy caring for them and it brings me a lot of happiness. We go for a lot of walks together near the sea and we like to swim. I lived in the Canary Islands for more than 18 months and I like to return. I love to read and research new artistic techniques so that I can use them in my art. And, of course, I love spending time with horses.


What has been your favourite piece of artwork that you have been asked to create?

I love them equally, they are my children so I cannot choose only one. All of my art pieces use a part of me. However, I do love to work on large canvases which require me to use all of my body as an expressive instrument.

Would you like to exhibit your artwork at SICAB again in the future?

SICAB was a fantastic experience and it is a good space to take the pulse of the PRE community. It would be great to return in the future. V.R.









MONEY CAN'T BUY HAPPINESS?

Following a recession which crumbled even some of the greatest economies, you are guaranteed to never be far away from someone reporting on the financial doom and gloom of Europe. But how did the Spanish horse become entangled in the mess left behind by the credit crunch? And, over 7 years down the line, how is it that we are still hearing tales of wonderfully bred PRE horses facing the worst kind of fate?

"First, let me make clear, this is not a charity or a rescue centre. It is merely me trying to buy horses from sad situations and rehome them without losing too much money. If I recoup my costs, I am able to continue saving and rehoming them," says Kate Hayes. Kate is based in Malaga, and has seen first-hand the destruction that the economic crash has left behind in the horse world. She is one of the people willing to stay behind and pick up the pieces.

Long favoured by royalty and the the well-to-do, many of us are aware that the PRE has a rather noble and very aristocratic history. It didn't take too long for the 'newly rich' to pick up on this either.

"In the nineties here in Malaga we had the 'boom'. Everyone was building houses and developers were getting rich quickly", says Kate. "As they did, it seemed that every builder and businessman felt the need to now get himself a PRE or - even better - a few PREs, and emulate the upper classes. This meant that people who knew nothing about horses were buying whatever they were sold. Some good ones. Some bad ones.. Probably all expensive!" says Kate. "Then these new 'experts' were breeding indiscriminately from their purchases with no attention paid to real quality." But what was the result of this?

"In 2005 we were flooded with ordinary PRE horses, who were not magnificent and fabulous, but merely nice, noble and useful." Surely, if the horses had a job to do, and an owner willing to keep them, it wouldnt be too bad? But then the recession hit, and the horses were a very costly hobby. "The market was flooded with them, and meat became the the destination of many of the ordinary horses", says Kate. And this is a fact that can't be denied. It has been reported that the amount of horses going for slaughter in Spain had tripled from 26,000 horses in 2007 to 73,000 in 2012. There were newspapers publishing stories about men so desperate, that they were taking things into their own hands and illegally killing their horses themselves. "Some of the prestigious studs even sent their stock for meat, declining to lower their reputation of excellence by accepting poor prices", says Kate. "A two- or three-year-old PRE could be

poor prices", says Kate. "A two- or three-year-old PRE could be bought for €200 to €300. Getting them registered and pass-ported would have cost the breeder more than that, so with the huge drop in value and the rising costs of keeping them.. Well, many were aware that it was no longer a good investment".

With a notable increase in rescue centres as well as individuals like Kate since the crash, it's worth asking how these good samaritans got involved in the first place.

"About 5 years ago, when my farrier said he had a few nice youngsters, I gave him €300 for a little filly called Candela. I was proud to register her myself with ANCCE and have her put into my name. We backed her and she went to a lovely lady in England. And then the waiting list of cheap skinny PREs was there and increasing. One at a time, I took them on and looked to rehome them".

"Most were very thin," Kate explains, "with a multitude of illnesses and infections. Strangles, flu, parasites, all sorts. So they generally stayed for a couple of months before going to the lovely people who offered them homes". But who were the main people rehoming these animals? How could they avoid the fate

that they had already been destined to once?

"They always went to be rehomed in the UK, as there is no market at all here".

Shelley Bastone, from Dartmoor, is just one of the few Spanish horse enthusiasts that rehomed one of Kate's refugees.

"I went to Spain on holiday with no intention of bringing a rescue back. I hadn't even considered that option. I already had four PREs so was very familiar with the breed and I have a great love for them. I saw Atrevida at Kate's and it was love at first sight! She was three-years-old when she arrived, so has spent the past year adjusting to life here and growing, but mostly eating! She was starved, skinny and had a big pot belly. Kate started her on the right road but I don't think she will ever get used to the fact that she has enough to eat now". So how are Shelley and Atrevida getting on in the UK? And was it the right decision?

"We have been walking her out and preparing for her new life under saddle", says Shelley. "She is a fabulous mare with a temperament to die for. A decision I've not regretted, she's a joy."

While the lucky ones are able to cross the channel to our green fields in the UK, it's worth giving a thought to the rest of them. But, of course, as much as we would like to the unfortunate truth is that we can't save them all. And while the future looks to have picked up for the horses in Spain, it still isn't back to where it was before the economy was turned upside down. "About 10 horses a year pass through my hands, and 5 or 6 are ANCCE passported", says Kate. "The others should be, but the cost of registering them is often more than their market value so many breeders, unfortunately, don't feel inclined to do so. This means that we have the 'PRE sin papeles', or in English, the unpapered PRE".

Sadly, it's a common sight that real quality horses go on their way to the butcher because people only want to buy passported ones. And while it is certainly the right thing to do in passporting your horse correctly, it's difficult to agree that the horses should be the ones making the ultimate payment for their owner's misfortune. Should you take a look on Spain's version of the common horse advertising websites, it is immediately obvious that the market is aflood with people trying to offload their once precious family friends. However, things do seem to be looking up in Spain.

"People who spend time with the Spanish horses here see how easy they are, how accepting of whatever is thrown at them, how generous and tractable and how easy to deal with they are. So they do have a following, for which I am very very relieved, it helps us home them".

And what does the future hold in terms of further rescues? "My own experience - which is the only place I can surmise from - is that there are not as many now. Thousands and thousands went for meat, but there are still far too many and the meat price now has risen, as demand has risen and supply decreased". Kate explains that she has plenty of commonly heard case studies which are a true testament to the Spanish horse.




And who was the last lucky horse to make its journey away from its desolate past?


